


#### **Wellbeing Matters**

As part of our annual NHS commitment to tackling colds and flus, our local immunisation team will be in again on **Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2024** to administer the nasal flu immunisation.

This FREE service is offered to all junior-aged children and further information has already been sent out to families. Only children for which consent has been granted will receive the flu immunisation- it is optional.



Reporting absences

On our automated system, press on ABSENCES to give a reason for your child missing school that day. Please ensure that you give us your child's name, class and reason for absence when leaving a message.

For any child without a reason for being absent, we will send out a message to parents asking you to contact us to explain your child's absence. Any unexplained absences will be recorded as unauthorised.
