

Pupil Premium Funding 2013-2014

The school received £102,600 Pupil Premium funding in the budget for 2013-14. Governors, teachers and the wellbeing team of staff decided to apportion the money to a range of provision with the aim of giving our most vulnerable children the opportunity to make good progress and achieve a variety of successes. We believe that confident happy children who are both well supported and taught skilfully will make the most progress and serve them with the skills they will need to achieve in the future.

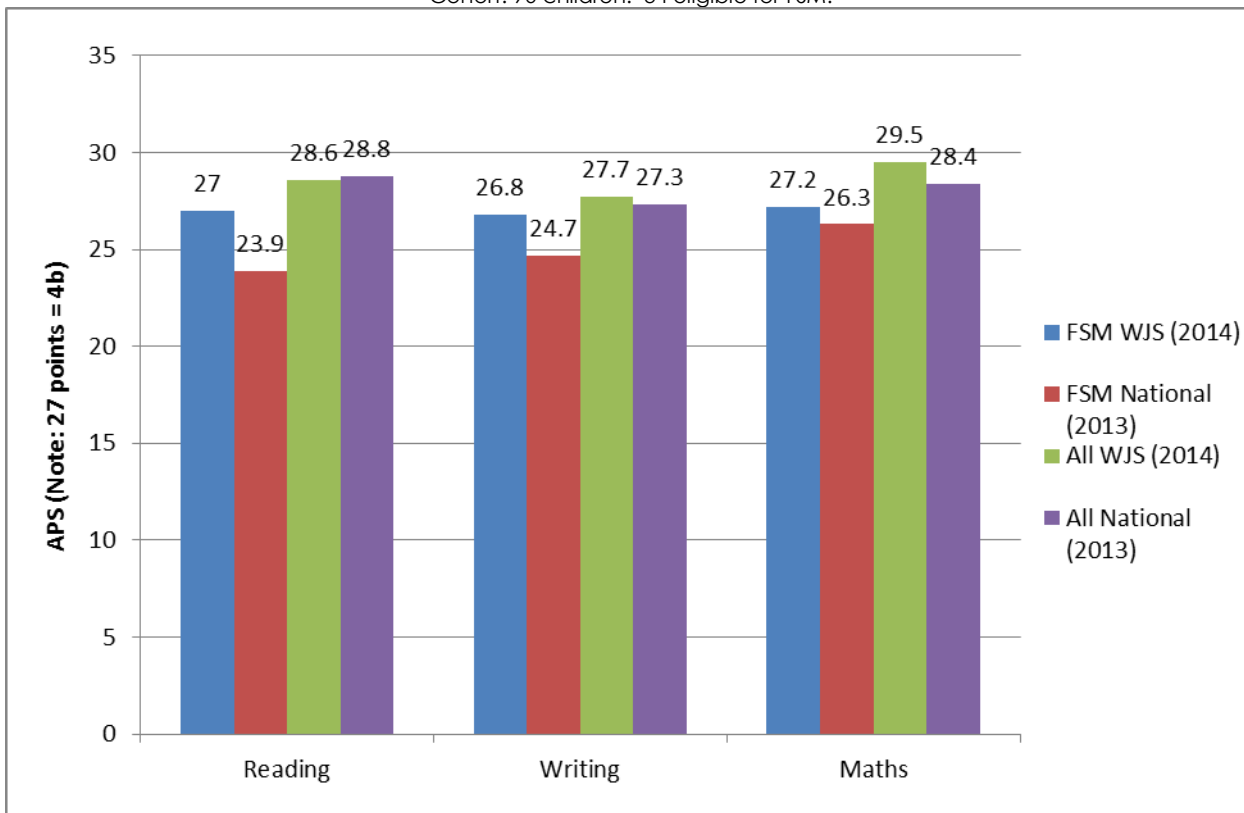
Teaching staff costs	£71,417.00
Including support teacher and specialist SEN teacher, class teachers offering extra classes before and after school, leader of family group and GREG (Grass Roots for English Group), one to one tuition by experienced teachers. Attendance at conferences on PP.	
Support staff costs	£18,701.00
Including 2 learning mentors, support at family group, some extra costs for FAST (Families and Schools Together), professional development opportunities eg course on emotional wellbeing and supporting vulnerable families.	
Professional Services	£6922.00
Maths online tutorials, reading volunteer service

We track progress of children in receipt of Pupil Premium at termly pupil progress reviews attended by governors.

Positive impact of this spending includes: improved attendance, rise in attainment and progress, increased participation in out of school hours' learning, improved self esteem and raised aspirations.
