<p>During this term we are learning about the Mayan Civilisation in our history lessons. There are many fascinating things about this civilisation such as their calendar, knowledge of astronomy, religious beliefs, architecture etc. What can you find out about a key aspect of the Mayan civilisation? Create something interesting of your choice (e.g. poster, PowerPoint, art piece etc.) to share with the rest of your class.</p>	<p>In science, we are learning about 'Evolution and Inheritance' and 'Living Things and their Habitats'. Research Alaskan Wood Frogs and write an explanation about how they have adapted to survive in the habitat they live in. You can include labelled drawings to support your explanation.</p>
<p>During our PSHE lessons this term we will be learning about 'living in the wider world'. How could you promote 'reuse, reduce and recycle' in our school and our local community? Create a poster, leaflet or PowerPoint that you could share with others that would promote a change in their behaviour resulting in a positive impact on the environment we live in.</p>	<p>We are studying Sikhism, Buddhism and Christianity this term in our RE lessons. Easter is a very special time for Christians. Can you create your own Easter Story picture book for Year 3 pupils? Your book will need to be bright and engaging as well as the key aspects of the Easter story being clear so that it can be understood by Year 3 pupils.</p>
